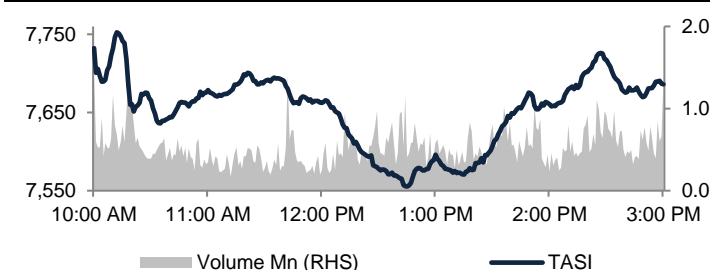

Major Economic News

- According to S&P Global Platts, the once-deep interest for high sulfur fuel oil (HSFO) has faded due to the implementation of a global marine sulfur cap; KSA could be the answer to the challenges awaiting the high sulfur fuel oil (HSFO) market. (Source: Argaam)
- According to a study, KSA is likely to spend USD1.1tn in developing infrastructure over 2019–38, while the UAE is expected to invest USD 350.0bn during this period. These large-scale development schemes are likely to permit local companies in the region to substitute imports and grow non-oil exports. (Source: Argaam)
- According to online travel company Cleartrip, mobile travel bookings in GCC increased 168.0% in 1H2018, with Oman and Saudi Arabia taking the top spot. KSA witnessed a 218.0% rise in mobile transactions, equal to 29.0% of all bookings; Oman posted 130.0% growth, with 35.0% of mobile transactions. (Source: Argaam)
- KSA's General Authority for Statistics (GASTAT), starting from September 24, is likely to launch three new agricultural surveys for 35 days. With a focus to reinforce food security in the Kingdom, a total of 550 specialists would participate in the surveys. (Source: Argaam)

Major Corporate News

- The Saudi Investment Bank (SAIB) held an extraordinary general assembly on September 26 to vote on the buyback of JPMorgan International Finance Limited's stake in the bank. SAIB would buy back 56.25 mn shares, representing 7.49% of capital, at a total value of SAR 759.31mn (SAR 13.50 per share). (Source: Argaam)

Market Analysis

- The Saudi Stock Exchange decreased 0.4% to 7,687.8 on Thursday. The value traded stood at SAR 3.7bn (down 5.6% over previous day), while the advance-decline ratio stood at 95/80. The parallel market index decreased 2.1% to 2,567.2 points. The value traded stood at SAR 0.5mn (down 73.9% over previous day). Most sectors in the main market ended in the red. Food & Beverages and Consumer Durables (up 2.4% and 1.3%, respectively) advanced the most; Energy and Materials (down 1.4% and 1.0%, respectively) led the laggards.

Regional and International Markets

- Among other regional markets, Dubai increased 0.3%, while Abu Dhabi decreased 0.2%. Kuwait decreased 0.1%, while Oman, Bahrain and Egypt increased 0.1%, 0.3% and 0.3%, respectively. Meanwhile, Qatar remained flat.
- According to Baker Hughes, North America's rig count decreased to 1,252 from 1,276 in the week ended September 07. Rig count remained same at 1,048 in the US and rose to 17 from 16 in the Gulf of Mexico. Rig count in Canada decreased to 204 from 228 earlier. (Source: Econoday)
- US Unemployment level remained unchanged at 3.9% (consensus: 3.8%) in August as compared to 3.9% in prior month. However, employers are having to pay more to attract workers as average hourly earnings rose by 0.1% to 2.9%. Moreover, labour participation rate edged lower by 0.2% to 62.7% in August. However, average working hours in a week remained unchanged at 34.5 hours. (Source: Econoday)
- Oil prices rose 0.4% on Friday, as prospects for tighter production later this year when U.S. oil sanctions on Iran take effect provided some support.
- Gold prices fell 0.4% on Friday, as positive monthly data on U.S. jobs supported the likelihood for further interest-rate hikes this year and provided a lift to the dollar.
